


PRESENT SIMPLE ROLL SENTENCES


This is a fun way to practise sentence building and writing. Before playing the game revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity.

Roll a dice twice.
Using the numbers from each rolls, build a silly sentence (positive, negative or question forms).

For example, 1-6:
A dog never plays tennis on Monday.
